DIPLOMA EXAM

The oral diploma exam is organised after the sixth semester and completes the three-year course of BA studies. It can be taken during the summer examination session or during the September retake examination session. The exam covers a selected field.

The following fields are available:

1. Linguistics
2. Applied linguistics and foreign language teaching
3. Translation studies
4. English literature and literary studies
5. American literature and literary studies

At the beginning of the fifth semester, a list of topics related to each of the above fields is announced.

The exact conditions for taking the diploma examination are specified in § 45 of the Study Regulations. The examination board consists of three members of the academic staff: the chairperson, the thesis supervisor and the thesis reviewer. The exam is in English. The students draw three questions from a set of questions based on the list of topics related to a given field.

The final grade is calculated on the basis of the formula specified in § 45 of the Study Regulations.
